Today you're going to gather objects from around your home to make a temporary sculpture. Then you will photograph your sculpture and sketch your sculpture using a pencil. You may want to think about our recent work on optical illusions and the skill of shading for this activity. There are some examples of sculptures below and Miss Buxton's (Y5WH) example of her sketch.

Miss Buxton's top tips.

Don't worry about your sculpture being 'too simple,' as our main focus is recreating the sculpture as a sketch.

When shading, think about where the light is coming from on your picture. On mine, it came from the right so most of my shadow was on the left of my image.

Try to take a picture both with and without flash so you can see both the outline of the objects and where the shadow will fall. Miss Buxton's examples are as follows.
