At the start of April, DJS hosted our first MAST coffee morning of this academic year, and it was great to see a wide range of parents/ carers from an array of year groups! The session was led by the MAST area manager, Paul O'Neill, who shared information on what MAST (Multi-Agency Support Teams) is, what support they can provide families with, and answered more case specific queries from the parents/ carers that attended. Parents were networking incredibly well and we want to say a massive thank you to those who attended and to those who have then gone

on to request further guidance and support from MAST following the coffee morning. Some of the areas of support that MAST can support families with are:

- children who are missing school
- children with challenging behaviour
- children with sleep issues
- children and adults with emotional and mental health issues
- families affected by domestic abuse

We do understand that not everyone is able to attend events like the coffee morning for multiple reasons, however, if you ever feel that you have concerns which you would like further support with, MAST are always a great option. To book in a MAST advice session then please get in contact with school so that we can set this up with our MAST link worker. Alternatively, if you would like to make a self-referral to MAST then this too is an option.
