Terracycle Scheme

Terracycle is a scheme that helps us to recycle 'hard to recycle' products and packaging. Everyone is able to join Terracycle and send off products for free as well as joining, like we have, as Dobcroft Schools to raise money from the weight of rubbish we send to them. At present Dobcroft Schools are registered with the following Terracycle schemes:



- Dental care recycling
- Cheese
- Crisps
- Marigold

The recycling bins are located at the infant school entrance in the carpark.

Unfortunately, our involvement in this scheme is in danger of coming to an end as there are no longer the number of volunteers required to carry out key roles. The following are a few key requirements of what is needed to help the system to continue:

- Manage the signage and labelling of bins (needs to be checked and re-done as and when, perhaps quarterly).
- Collect the rubbish as per time frames (potentially sort as there will be some contamination) check there are weights in the bottom when bin is emptied. Wheelie bin bags are used to make collection easier.
- Weigh and send off the boxed rubbish to Terracycle.
- If you're passing check all the bins are in good condition and the lids are on securely (located at the infant school gates

They learnt a lot about UK law, particularly regarding arson, theft, hate crime and knife crime and even took part in a mock magistrate's court trial! They became junior Crime Scene Investigators whilst learning about Child Criminal Exploitation, learnt what to do if a fire broke out in their home, how to be safe near open water and how to stay safe whilst travelling on buses and whilst crossing the road. It was certainly a fun but educational day enjoyed by all!

Our school enthusiastically participated in the NSPCC Number Day on Friday 2nd February. Children had a great time engaging in various mathematical activities. From exciting investigations to challenging math puzzles, the day was filled with fun and learning.
