Within one minute $\mathbf{= 1 0}$ marks
Between 1 minute and 2 minutes $=9$ marks
Between 2 minutes and $\mathbf{3}$ minutes $=8$ marks
Between 3 minutes and 4 minutes $=7$ marks
Between 4 minutes and 5 minutes $=6$ marks
Between 5 minutes and 6 minutes $=5$ marks
Between 7 minutes and 8 minutes $=4$ marks
Between 8 minutes and 9 minutes $=\mathbf{3}$ marks
Between 9 minutes and 10 minutes $\mathbf{=} \mathbf{2}$ marks
Anything after 10 minutes = 1 mark

Timed paper. You will need a stopwatch.
Starting in the room of your choice, ask a member of your household to time how long it takes to find the objects below. You can find the items in any order. The times will show you how many points you can achieve. Add a 10 second penalty for any objects not found.

FIND THE FOLLOWING OBJECTS:

- An unused toilet roll
- An item of clothing that is the colour you would get if you mixed blue and yellow together
- An item of clothing that has at least 4 buttons on
- A pen, pencil or crayon that is the top colour of a rainbow
- The word 'SCHOOL' - look in a book, magazine or newspaper
- Your school jumper
- A dessert spoon
- A school photograph of yourself
- Something that will hold everything you have found

You can receive up to 10 marks.
Within 5 minutes $=10$ marks Between 5 minute and 6 minutes $=9$ marks Between 6 minutes and 7 minutes $=8$ marks Between $\mathbf{7}$ minutes and 8 minutes $=7$ marks Between 8 minutes and 9 minutes $=6$ marks Between 9 minutes and 10 minutes $\mathbf{= 5}$ marks Between 10 minutes and 11 minutes $=4$ marks Between 11 minutes and 12 minutes $\mathbf{3}$ marks Between 12 minutes and 13 minutes $=2$ marks
