

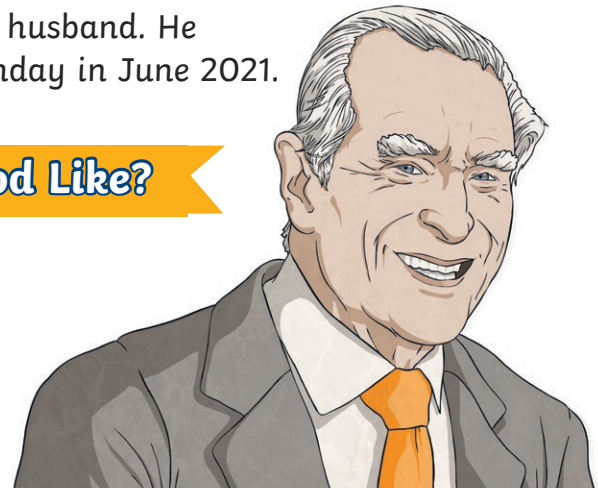
The Life of Prince Philip

What Was the Prince's Childhood Like?

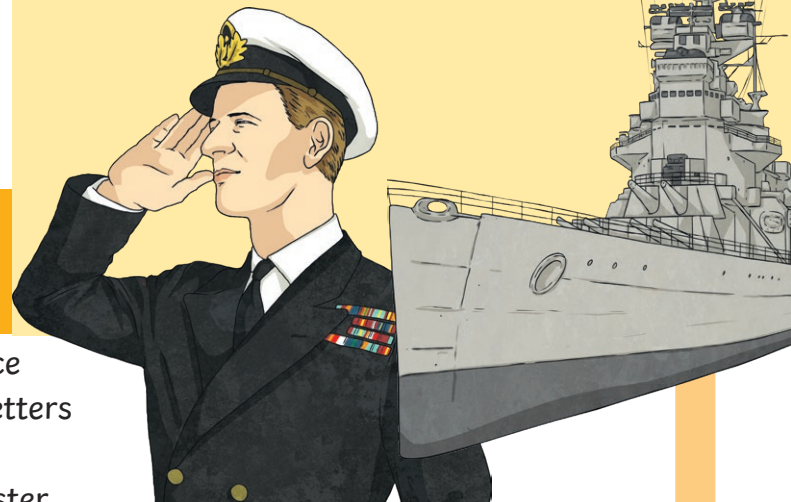
Prince Philip was born in Greece on 10th June 1921. His royal title was 'Prince of Greece and Denmark'. The prince had four older sisters and his parents were Prince Andrew of Greece and Princess Alice of Battenberg. Prince Philip and his family had to leave Greece when he was a baby because of problems in the country.

The prince joined the Royal Navy after he finished school and he fought for Britain during the Second World War.



Did You Know... ?

The prince left Greece on a ship inside a cot made from an old orange box.



When Did the Prince Meet The Queen?



Prince Philip had known The Queen since she was a young princess. They wrote letters to each other during the Second World War. The pair were married at Westminster Abbey in 1947.

The prince was given the new titles of Duke of Edinburgh, Earl of Merioneth and Baron Greenwich after he married The Queen.

The royal couple have four children called Prince Charles, Princess Anne, Prince Andrew and Prince Edward. They also have eight grandchildren and ten great-grandchildren.

Their eldest son Prince Charles is the next to become king followed by his grandson Prince William and his great-grandson Prince George.

How Does the Prince Support The Queen?

Prince Philip was The Queen's royal **consort** for over 60 years. He spent most of his life performing **royal duties**. Prince Philip stopped his royal duties in 2017 when he was 96 years old.

Prince Philip had a strong interest in sport, the environment, science and technology. He was involved with hundreds of charities throughout the world. The prince created the Duke of Edinburgh's Award for young people to help them to improve their life skills.

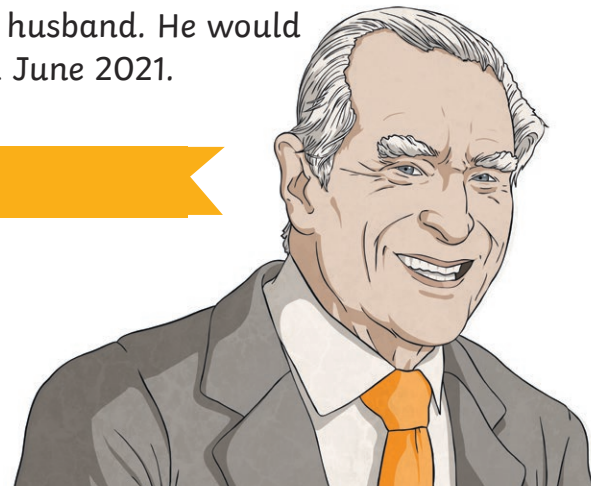

Early Life

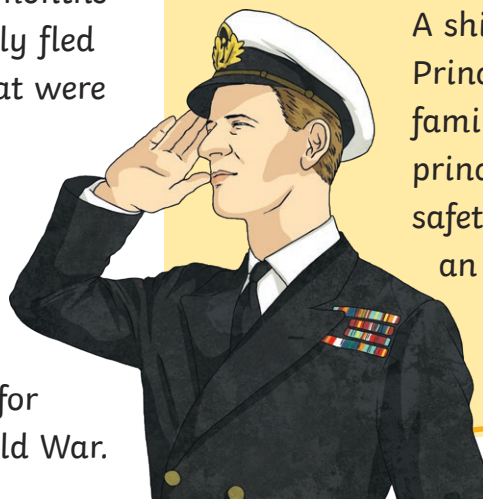

When he was 18 months old, Prince Philip and his family fled Greece because of problems that were affecting his uncle, the King.

Prince Philip then went to different schools around Europe. After finishing his education, he became a **cadet** in the Royal Navy and fought for Britain during the Second World War.

Marriage to The Queen

Prince Philip had known The Queen since she was young. At the time, she was called Princess Elizabeth. After the Second World War, Prince Philip proposed to the princess and they were married at Westminster Abbey in 1947.

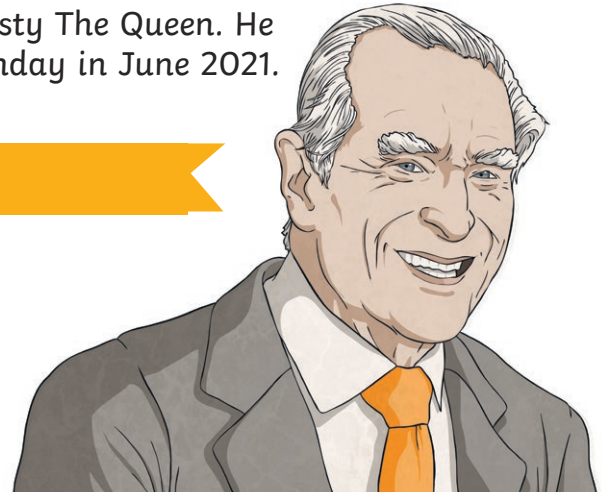

Early Life

Prince Philip was born on the island of Corfu, Greece on 10th June 1921. When he was born, his title was 'Prince of Greece and Denmark'. His parents were Prince Andrew of Greece and Princess Alice of Battenberg and he had four older sisters. When he was 18 months old, Prince Philip and his family had to leave Greece because of political problems that were affecting his uncle, Constantine I, King of Greece. A navy ship was sent to collect Prince Philip and his family and the young prince was transported to safety in a cot made from an old orange box.



Prince Philip attended several different schools around Europe before completing his education in Scotland. In 1939, he then went on to become a **cadet** in the Royal Navy where he served onboard several ships during the Second World War.



Marriage to The Queen

Prince Philip and Princess Elizabeth, as The Queen was previously titled, had known each other since childhood. After the Second World War, Prince Philip proposed to the princess and they were married at Westminster Abbey in 1947.

Prince Philip gave up his Greek titles and became a British citizen so that he could marry The Queen. After they were married, he was given new titles of Duke of Edinburgh, Earl of Merioneth and Baron Greenwich.

The royal couple went on to have four children: Prince Charles, Princess Anne, Prince Andrew and Prince Edward. The prince carried on serving with the Royal Navy until Princess Elizabeth's **coronation** in 1952.



Interests and Charity Work

Members of the royal family attend around 2,000 **official engagements** every year. Prince Philip was the longest-serving British **consort** and accompanied The Queen for over 60 years. As well as these royal duties, Prince Philip enjoyed sport, the environment, engineering and technology. The prince had a love of flying and could fly most types of planes.

Prince Philip was involved with around 780 organisations throughout the world. He was a president of the World Wildlife Fund since it was first set up in 1961.

In 1956, the prince created the Duke of Edinburgh's Award for young people to help them to improve their life skills. Over 3.1m DofE Awards have been given out so far.

Later Life

In 2017, Prince Philip retired from public duties at the age of 96. He has eight grandchildren and ten great-grandchildren. His eldest son, Prince Charles, is the next in line to the throne followed by his grandson Prince William and his great-grandson, Prince George.
