<b>Major City</b>	<b>A big city with lots of people living there.</b>
<b>Capital City</b>	<b>Where a country`s government is located.</b>
<b>City</b>	<b>Any place in the UK that has a cathedral.</b>
<b>Region</b>	<b>An area considered as a unit for geographical purposes.</b>
<b>Counties</b>	<b>Counties are areas within regions of the UK. Every city, town and village belongs to a county.</b>
<b>Eight points of compass</b>	<b>The compass directions.</b>
<b>Tributary</b>	<b>The point where a smaller river joins a larger river.</b>
<b>Confluence</b>	<b>Where two or more flowing bodies of water join together to form a single channel.</b>
<b>Compass</b>	<b>A magnetic instrument used for finding direction.</b>
<b>Island</b>	<b>A piece of land surrounded by water.</b>
