This is a Christian crib. It shows Jesus being born in a stable in Bethlehem with Mary and Joseph, the shepherds and the wise men as well as some animals.



This is a Hanukkah Menorah. It has 9 candles and represents the 8 days of Hanukkah. The central candle is used to light the other candles.



This is a Diwali candle that Hindus use to celebrate the festival of Diwali - their festival of light.



This is Rama and Sita - a couple in Hindu mythology whose story is connected with Diwali, the festival of light.
