<p>Saturation</p>	 <p>Low saturation - High Saturation</p> <p>Low saturation is a more lifelike picture High saturation is a brighter picture</p>	<p>Analogue art - any art where the material making the art is manipulated by hand, like paint.</p> <p>Digital art - any art where the material making the art is manipulated by computer</p> <p>Hardware - the machines, wiring, and other physical components of a compute</p> <p>Software - the programs and other operating information used by a computer</p> <p>Crop- remove part of (a photograph or other image) in order to produce a better picture or to fit a given space.</p> <p>Resize - alter the size of something</p> <p>Edit - to make a change or correction</p> <p>Layer - Using layers to overlap each other gives depth to an illustration. They are like stacked sheets of transparent paper.</p> <p>Effects - digital changes to make images look different</p> <p>Enhance - to improve, intensify or increase something</p> <p>Saturation - how intense colours are in an image</p> <p>Temperature - this generally refers to how "warm" or "cool" a colour is</p> <p>Focus - whether an image is blurry or clear</p>	
<p>Temperature</p>	 <p>Cooler colours - warmer colours</p> <p>Cooler colours show sad or calm messages Warmer colours show exciting messages</p>		
<p>Focus</p>	 <p>In focus - out of focus</p> <p>In focus shows detail in an image Out of focus blurs images - these are great for background images</p>	 <p>Keith Haring</p> <p>Recall: Can you remember what these words mean?</p> <p>Image: a picture or cartoon of something</p> <p>Graphic: a picture or an image that is displayed on a computer screen or in print</p> <p>Copyright: Copyright shows that someone has created something and that they own the rights to it</p> <p>Design: purposefully considering what something looks like.</p>
