Christian symbol

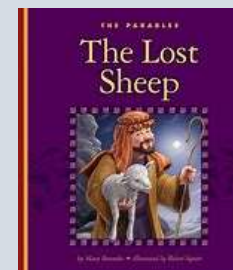
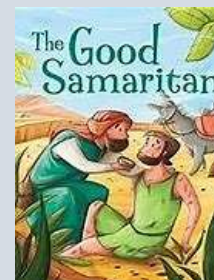


Muslim symbol

Christians believe that Jesus was crucified (died) on a cross on Good Friday and was resurrected back to life on Easter Sunday - 2 days later.



Jesus told stories, called parables, to teach people how to live their lives in good ways. Some examples of parables include The Good Samaritan and The Lost Sheep.



Muslims believe that the prophet Muhammad (pbuh) received the words of the Qur'an as revelations from Allah.
