Holy Communion is a Christian ritual where Christians share bread and wine to remind them of Jesus' sacrifice when he died on the cross.



The bread represents Jesus' body.

The wine represents Jesus' blood.

These are Rangoli patterns. Rangoli patterns are bright patterns on the floor by the door to welcome visitors into Hindu homes. Traditional Rangoli patterns. During the Hindu festival of Diwali, bright patterns are drawn on the floor to encourage the goddess Lakshmi to enter their homes.
