Active Travel

We are thrilled to share that our first month following the Living Streets Active Travel Initiative has been a tremendous success! Since November, our school community has completed an incredible 5,851 active journeys to school, and we have already awarded 338 Active Travel badges to students



who have made an active travel choice at least once a week for four weeks. We are currently ranked 3rd in our local authority area for combined activity and engagement, and 16th on the national leader board—an achievement we're incredibly proud of!

This success wouldn't have been possible without your continued support in encouraging and enabling the children to make healthy, sustainable travel choices. We can't wait to award even more badges in the months ahead and continue this fantastic journey together. Thank you for helping us make active travel a priority!
