Peasantry	Poor people who worked the land.		
Social class	Where you are in society based on how much money you earn.		
Society	A group of people who live, work and co-operate together, generally following some shared rules.		
Government	The group of people who rule over a country or state.		
Law	The system of rules for a country.		
Oppression	Cruel or unjust treatment over a long period of time.		
Industrialisation	The development of industries in a country or region on a wide scale.		
Industrial revolution	The period of time where things stopped being made by hand and started being made by machines.		
Urbanisation	The process of making an area more urban (city-like).		
Engine	A machine with moving parts that turns power into motion.		
Transportation	Moving goods from one place to another by means of a vehicle, aircraft or ship.		
Steel	A hard, strong material made from a mixture of metals.		
Mining	The process of extracting something from the ground e.g. coal		
Child labour	The employment of children in an industry or business.		
Cholera	A serious illness caused by people swallowing contaminated water.		
Public health	A branch of medicine dealing with hygiene and disease prevention.
