What happens to the animals?

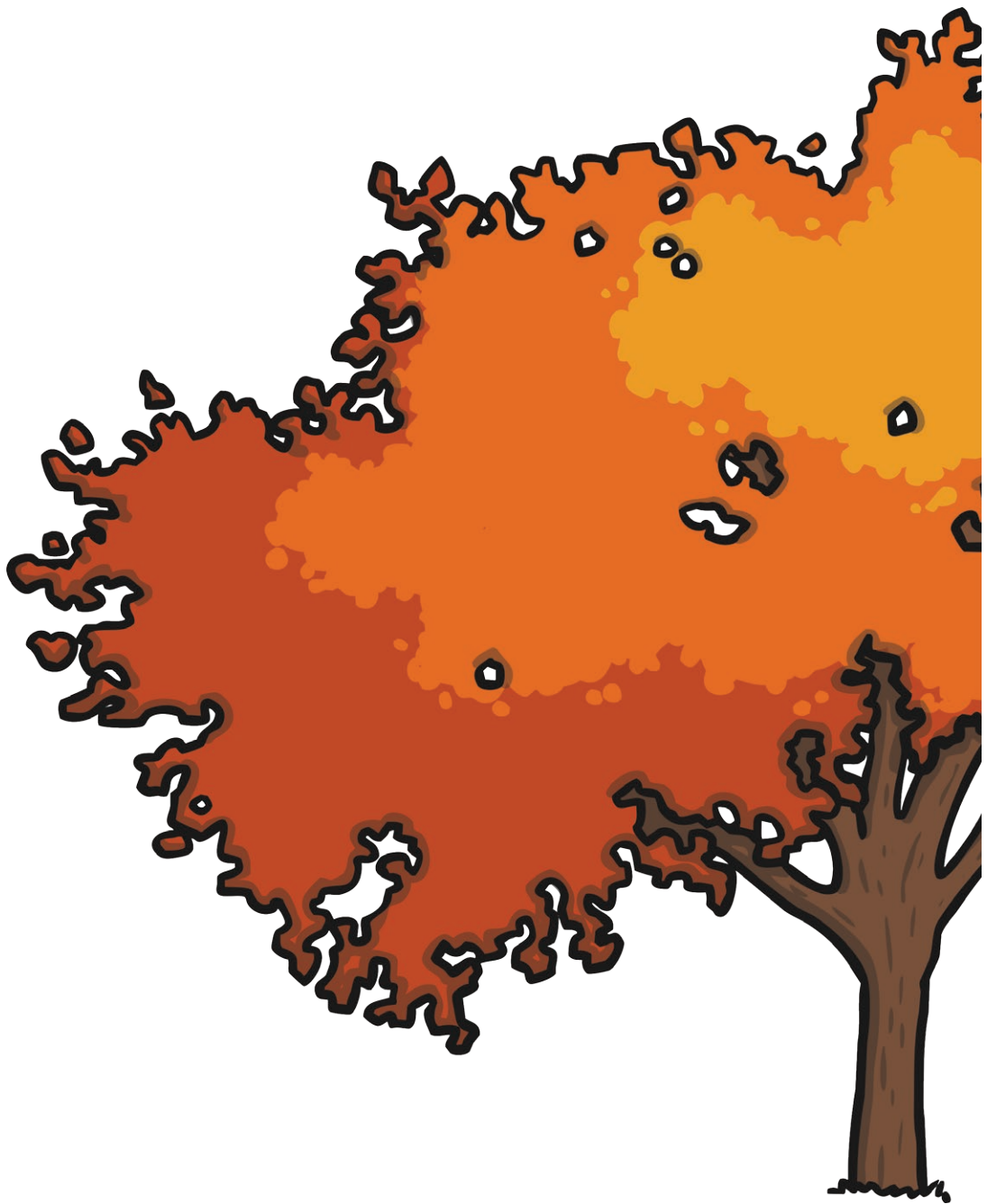

Hedgehogs hibernate through autumn and winter. They collect lots of berries and eat them all before rolling themselves up tightly into a ball and falling asleep in deep mounds of leaves.

During autumn, squirrels will go out to collect nuts and acorns. They dig a hole in the ground and store their supply of food. They stay in their nests through the winter, only coming out to eat their gathered food or to find more.

Wasps all die out in autumn and winter, but the queen survives in the nest. When spring returns, the queen builds up a new colony. Most other insects hide underground or travel to live in warmer places during the cold seasons.

Geese, along with swans and ducks, migrate during autumn. Geese fly south for the winter to find a warmer place to live and fly north again for the spring.

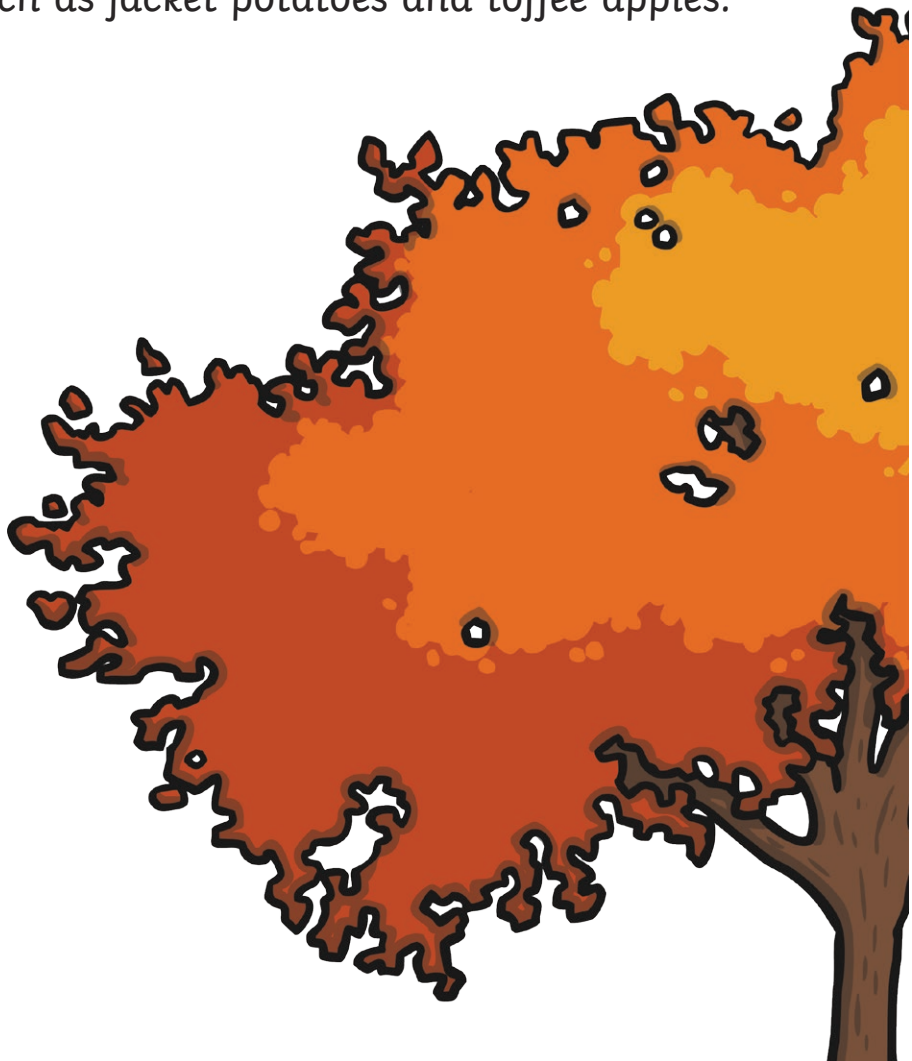
