Past and present (simple)





Verbs indicate that someone or something is doing, feeling or being.

verbs

Louise loves her cat.

verbs

sat.

Louise's cat sleeps all day long.

I sympathise.

absolutely adore my budgie.

Usually verbs have the name of a person or thing or a pronoun in front of them.

# Verbs have a tense.

They can tell us when the action happened.



Louise's cat caught a mouse.

In the **past** 

or in the **present**.

My budgie sings all day long.

# Verbs have a tense.

They can tell us when the action happened.

You do not have to smile.

# Past tense The sheep walked. She carried a bag. I ate an ice-cream. Present tense The sheep walks. She carries a bag. I eat an ice-cream.



For regular verbs we add <u>ed</u> to show that an action is in the past and complete.

walk<u>ed</u>

jump<u>ed</u>





# Simple past

It rained and rained.

It rains and rains.

Louise carries the cat.

We do not want to go.

We are lost!
